A New Milestone for GatE: The Awareness Campaign Strategy Has Been Delivered!

In **February 2026**, the GatE project delivered its **Awareness Campaign Strategy**, establishing the framework for the project's awareness and recruitment activities. Building on the Gender-Responsive Blueprint, the strategy defines target audiences, key messages, communication pathways and three flagship campaigns: **Discover Your Green Future, Second Chance – Green Chance and Women Powering the Transition**. The strategy will guide inclusive actions to promote women's participation in the Green Energy Transition.



Transnational Project Meeting in Cádiz

On **18-19 March 2026**, the GatE consortium met in **Cádiz** for its **2nd Transnational Project Meeting**, hosted by **APEC**. Partners reviewed the progress achieved during the first year of implementation and co-designed the next steps, including upcoming policy workshops, advocacy events, and the development of the GatE course and platform.



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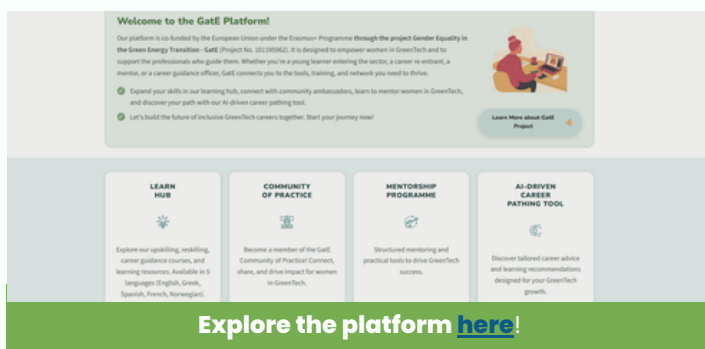

Policy Workshops Driving Change Across Europe

Between **May and June 2026**, the GatE project organised **three national** and **one EU-level** policy workshops to identify practical solutions for advancing gender equality in the green energy transition.

Greece focused on improving women's **access to green skills**, **Spain** explored **workforce participation and retention**, while **Belgium** examined **governance and policy alignment** at national and European levels.

Participants prioritised **mentoring**, **flexible** training, **inclusive** policies, stronger **partnerships**, and **better gender-disaggregated data** to support women.

The outcomes of the workshops will directly inform the **GatE Policy Influence Toolkit**, shaping evidence-based recommendations for regional, national and EU policymakers.



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
